Nonverbal Skills				
Eye Contact	You did not attempt to look at audience at all.	You only focused attention to one particular part of the class, you did not scan audience.	Occasionally you looked at someone or some groups during presentation.	You constantly looked at someone or some groups at all times.
Posture	You faced your back to the audience; reading slides.	You sat during presentation.	You occasionally slumped during presentation or leaned on podium.	You stood up straight with both feet on the ground.
Vocal Skills				
Enthusiasm	You showed absolutely no interest in the topic presented.	You showed some negativity toward topic presented.	You occasionally showed positive feelings about topic.	You demonstrated a strong positive feeling about topic during entire presentation.
Vocalized Pauses (uh, well uh, um)	You said 10 or more vp's.	You said 6-9 vp's.	You said 1-5 vp's.	You did not use any vocalized pauses.
